My Erasmus experience in Düsseldorf was an enriching journey that spanned 16 weeks of classes and 2 weeks of exams in total. One of the highlights of my stay was the diversity of the students. I made friends from all over the world, each widen my vision of life and bringing unique perspectives of different cultures. Living in Düsseldorf also meant navigating everyday life in a new language. While initially daunting, this challenge improved my German and boosted my confidence. The local community was patient and encouraging, making the transition smoother than I had anticipated.

Exploring Germany and neighboring countries was another unforgettable aspect of my Erasmus. From weekend trips to Cologne and Berlin to a quick getaway to Amsterdam, each adventure was one of its kind. Because of the unique location of the country, it was very easy to have short trips to further places by plane. And some of the trips I went, with the people I met during the Erasmus period and that was also made me very happy and made me to create lasting memories.

To future Erasmus students, I highly recommend immersing yourself fully in the experience. Embrace the challenges, cherish the friendships, and take every opportunity to explore.
